Victims of workplace violence miss

1.8 million

\$13,260 per violation

and increase to

\$132,598

for willful and repeat violations.

Employees in healthcare, education and professional services are unsure about their employers' preparedness plans for **workplace violence.**

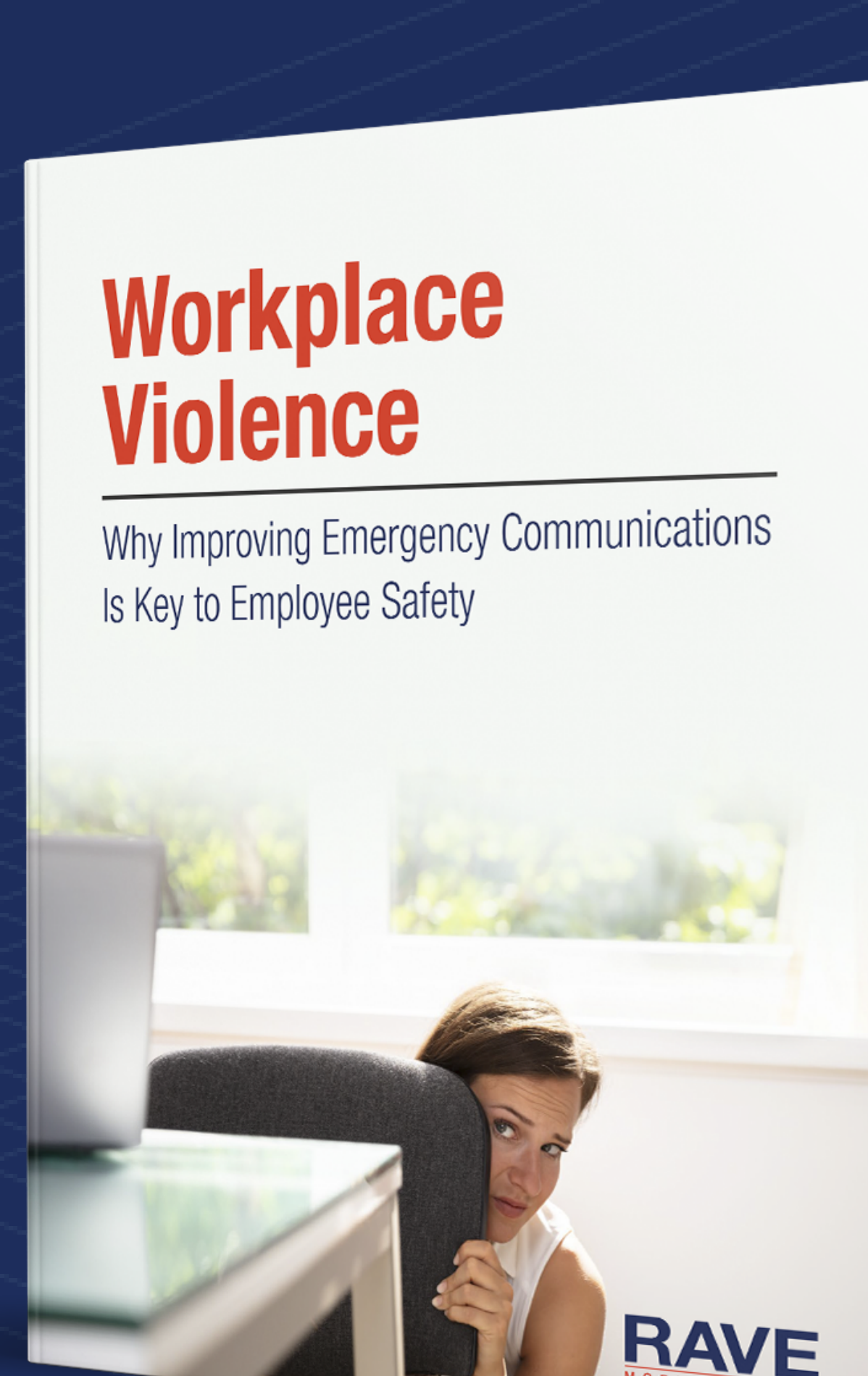

- **31% of education personnel** aren't aware of their school's emergency plans and drills are rarely performed
- **31% of healthcare employees** are unaware of their employers' emergency plans
- **32% of professional services staff members** feel their employer doesn't prioritize their safety, up from 24% in 2018
- **Half of professional services respondents** aren't sure what their employer's emergency plan is
