






The Financial Effects

- Domestic violence costs the U.S. economy \$67 billion in total pain, suffering and reduced quality of life
- every year in lost time, productivity and healthcare costs paid by the employer Over 7.9 million paid workdays are lost per year
- The lifetime economic costs related to injuries,
- lost productivity from paid work, criminal justice and other costs is \$3.6 trillion
