


Incidents of serious workplace violence were **4X MORE COMMON** in healthcare than in the private sector.*

No federal law exists that requires hospitals and healthcare facilities to implement plans to prevent workplace violence.

42 states have passed laws designating penalties when nurses are assaulted, including Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Massachusetts, New York, Ohio and Texas.
